Applicants interested in applying for a fellowship other than the 2009/2010 academic year should review the "open fellowships" document listed on OTA's website, and call the programs directly: <http://www.ota.org/fellowship/directory.html> (click on fellowship openings Alpha State)

The deadline to submit an application is August 1. In order for an application to be processed, a personal statement, photograph and CV must be uploaded. Three letters of recommendation are also required - these should be sent to the program(s) directly and not uploaded to the site.

Depending on the program(s) applied to, additional information may be requested (ie, medical school transcripts, board certification, dean's letter, etc).

The fellowship programs themselves will not have access to the applications until August 1, but will begin calling to set up interviews on or after this date. **It has been requested that no fellowship program extend an offer (2009/10 fellowship) until after the OTA meeting in October (October 22, 2007).**

**Pre-Proposal Deadline: April 2, 2007** (Accepted pre-proposals will be invited to submit a full grant application, due August 15, 2007)

- \* **rhBMP-2 (\$65,000/year, 2 - 3 year funding cycle)**
- \* **Clinical Study:** (\$50,000/year, 3 year funding cycle)  
This clinical study will be solicited through a request for proposals (RFP) in the following areas: \*
  - 1) **DVT Prophylaxis in Extremity Fractures**
  - 2) **Pharmacologic Treatment Strategies for Post-Traumatic Cartilage Injuries**
  - 3) **Effectiveness of the VAC for the Management of Surgical Incisions and Traumatic Wounds.**

\* A survey was sent to the OTA BOD and Research Committee with the purpose of compiling a list of the most important OTA clinical research topics. The topics were then rated by the BOD. The three top rated topics are listed above and will be used for the '08 clinical grant directed topics.
