If your usual nail extractor just does not fit, or fails to succeed in removing an intact or broken intramedullary nail, try this.

- 1. Insert a ball-tipped guide, and advance it out the end of your nail. If the nail-tip orifice) is really small, you may need to use a humeral guide wire.
- 2. Insert another regular or humeral guide wire, and advance it out the end of the nail, as well.
- 3. Now pull both guide wires back so the ball-tip, and both wires, are jammed outside the nail.
- 4. Grasp the free ends of both guide wires with a guide wire holder (cannulated T-handle chuck or equivalent) or a large pair of locking pliers (Vise-grip® or equivalent)
- 5. Slap hammer the nail out
