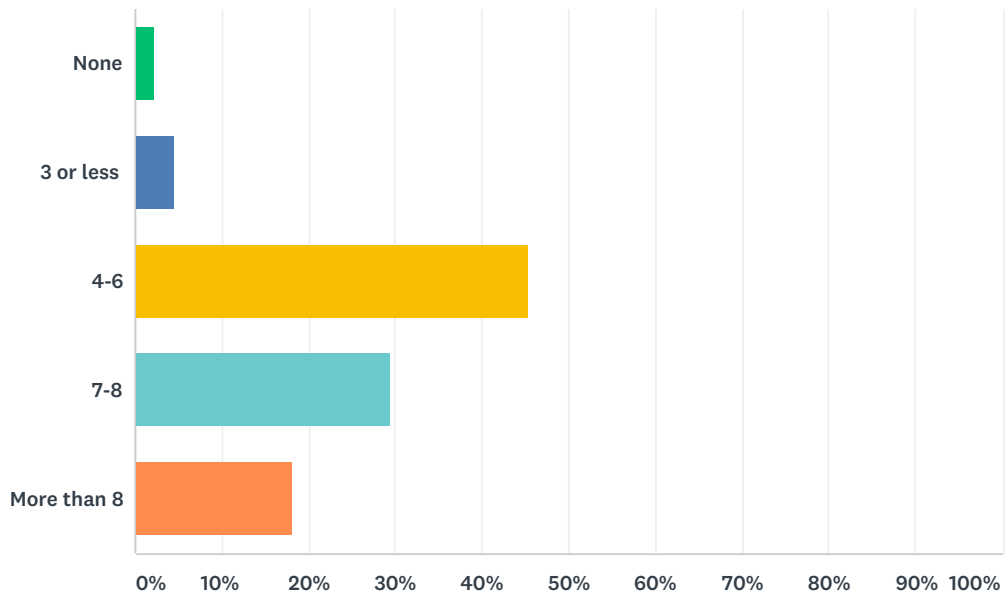

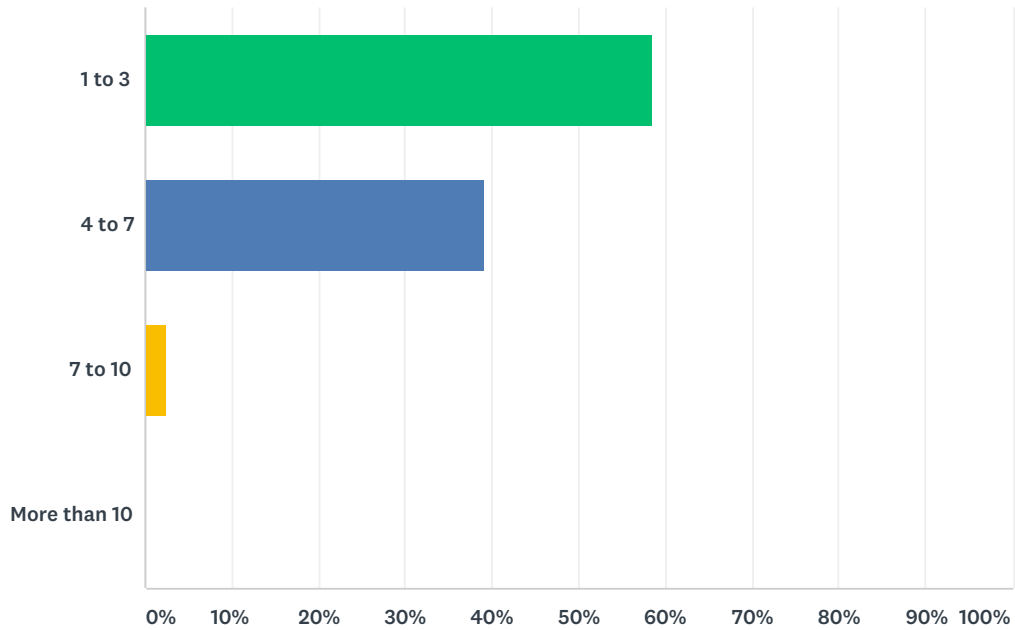

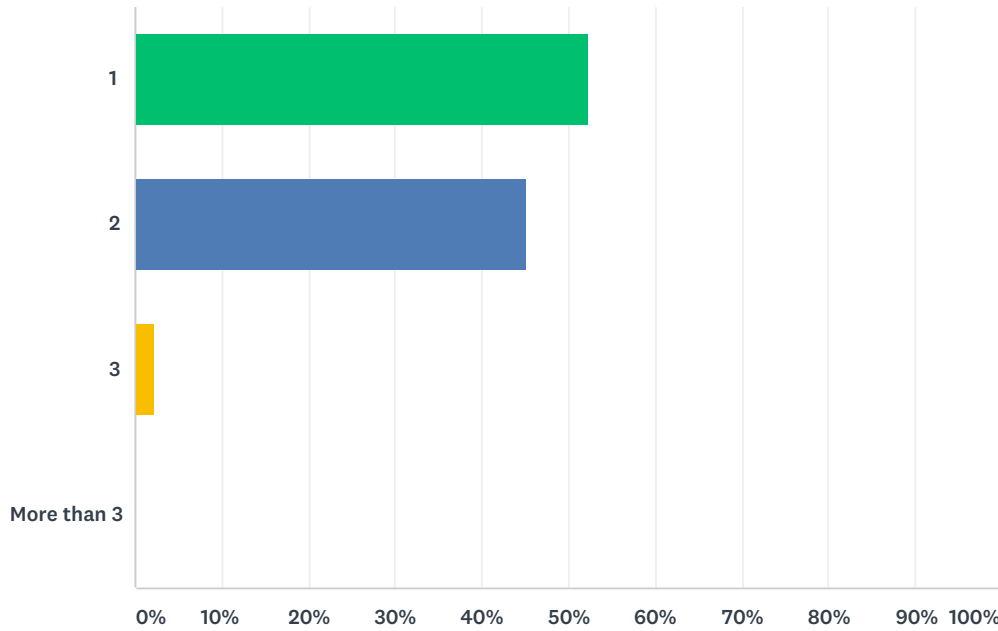

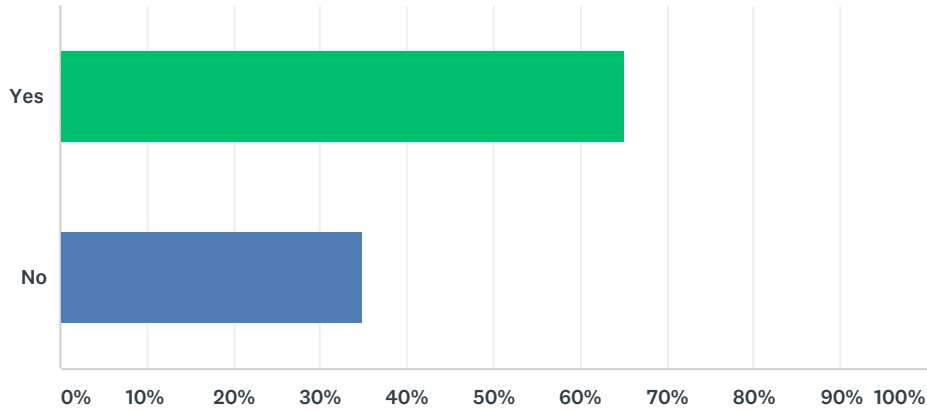

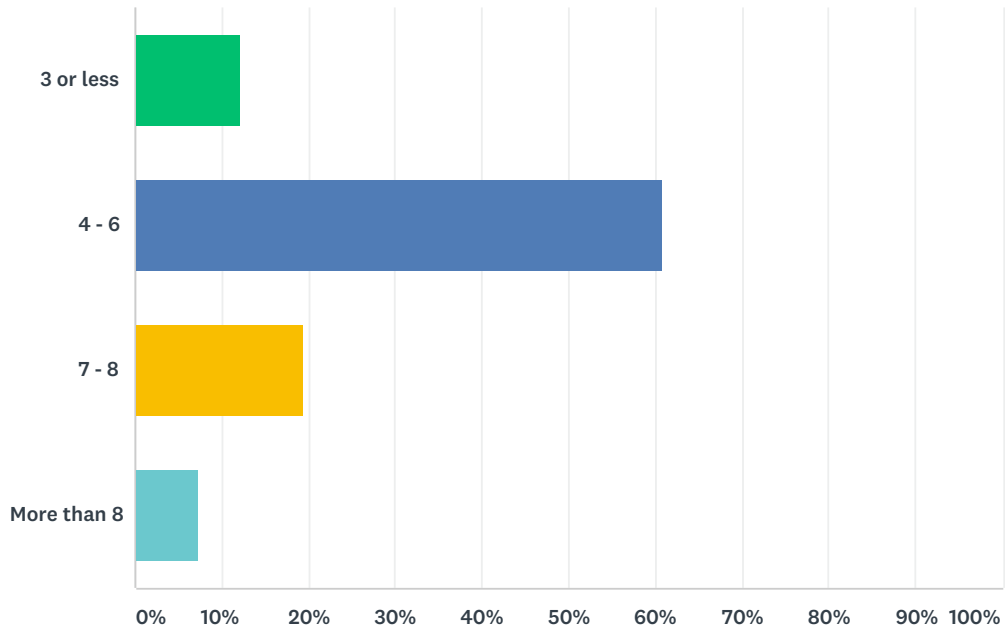

Q18 Number of nights on call expected per month:

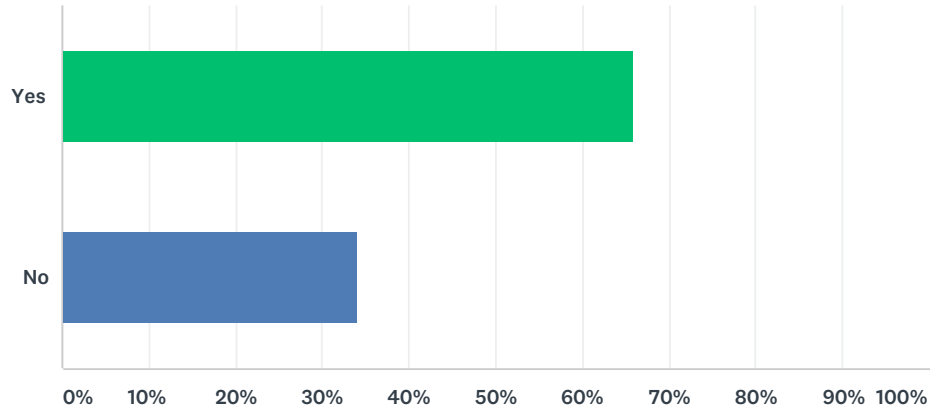

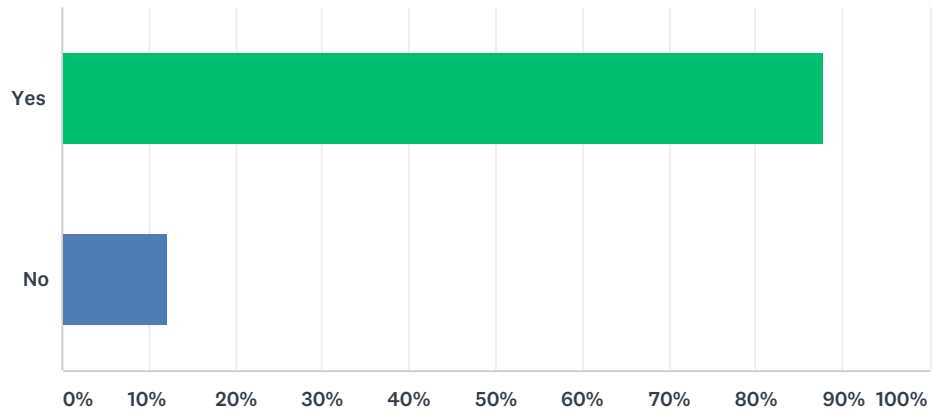

Q20 Do you have a dedicated trauma OR available to you?

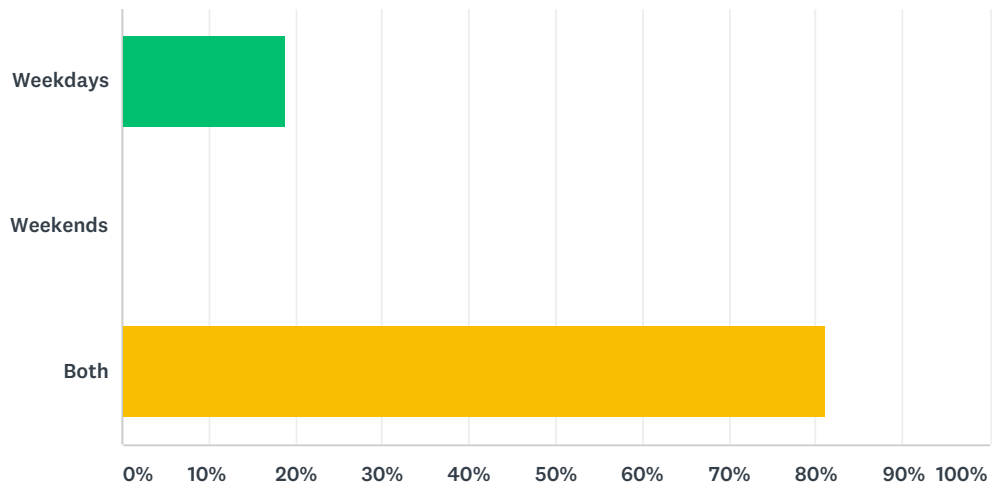

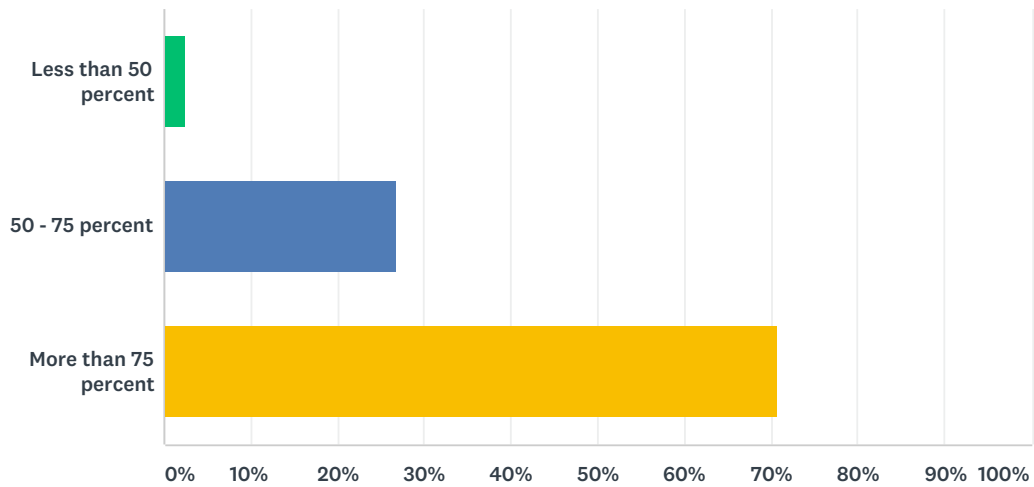

Q22 What percentage of your practice do you anticipate being devoted to trauma?

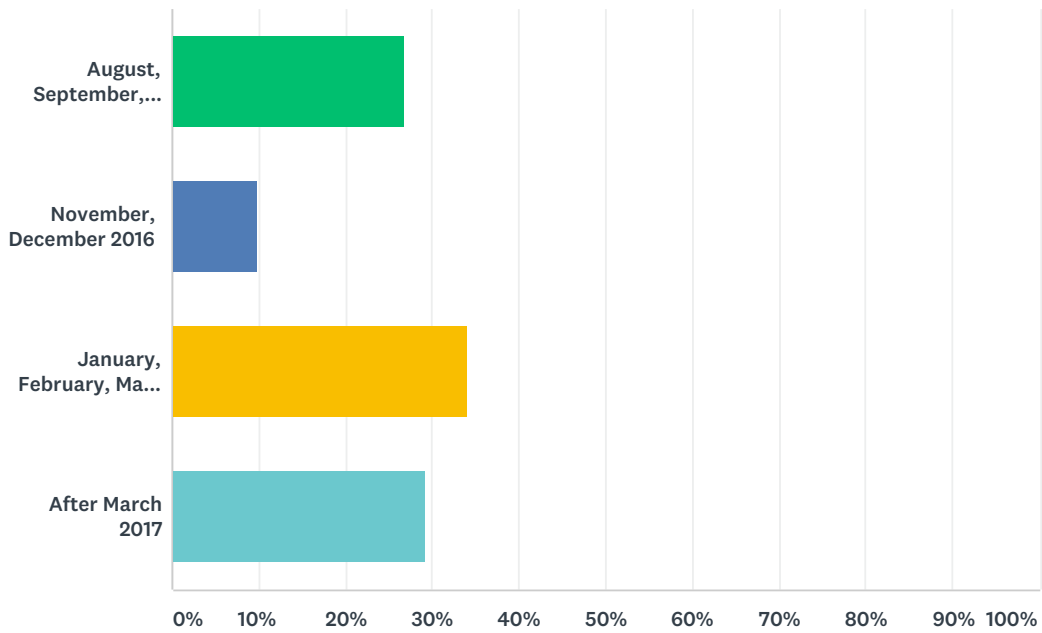
