The very first <u>Essentials of Lower Extremity Reconstruction Course</u> (ELER), will be held in Dallas Texas on January 20 and 21, 2023 (Friday/Saturday). This 2-day course is co-sponsored by the Limb Lengthening and Reconstruction Society (LLRS) and the faculty from the Baltimore Limb Deformity Course (BLDC).
