Research: Advance the care of orthopaedic trauma patients by identifying, initiating, supporting, and disseminating innovative and collaborative research.

Advocacy: Advocate for high-quality trauma patient care by providing evidence and insights to inform and influence health systems and public policy.

Global Partnership: Serve as the leading resource for partners to deliver the highest possible quality of musculoskeletal trauma care worldwide.

People: Empower orthopaedic colleagues to thrive in their careers and lives through mentorship, professional support, and commitment to diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Next steps will include:

- o New Task Force assignments, and resource allocations confirmed as needed
- o The work of creating action plans to achieve goals and attain deliverables
- o Plans to report further details and progress in February

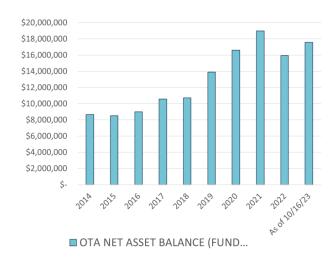


IV. CFO Report

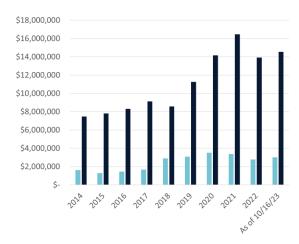


OTA Net Asset Balances over the Last 10 Years.

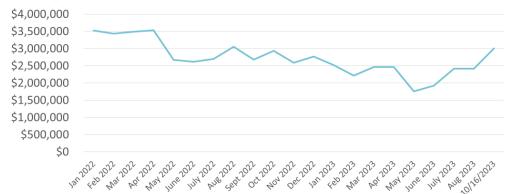
